Disney 2020 - Equipment & Luggage Departure Plan

Equipment and Luggage will be transported to Florida via box truck. On Wednesday, March 25th, all trip participants will arrive **per the following schedule** to drop off luggage and instruments for the trip. The truck will depart Maloney after packing is completed and will meet us in Florida on Friday. All personal luggage and instruments must go on the truck. There will be **NO CHECKED LUGGAGE** on this trip. We will not go to baggage claim.

Students may bring:

1. Carry-on piece of luggage. This should be a backpack – NOT A SMALL SUITCASE. This needs to be small enough to fit under the aircraft seat in front of you or the overhead bin above you. DO NOT OVERPACK THIS BAG.

What needs to be in this bag: **ID**, money, a change of clothes for the next day, any hygiene products (<u>deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrush please</u>) you may need in the morning (remember TSA guidelines), etc. Remember... anything you pack into this bag will have to be carried by you on the first day until you get to your room.

*See TSA guidelines for packing of all luggage. Failure to do so may jeopardize your participation on the trip. If you manage to bring items to the TSA gate, which are not permitted on the aircraft, those items will be discarded at the gate.

Note: ALL LUGGAGE WILL BE SEARCHED PRIOR TO LOADING. Any items found in violation of any policy will be grounds for removal from the trip without refund and disciplinary action.

JETBLUE AIRWAYS "GROUP" POLICIES

TRAVEL TIPS BEFORE ARRIVING AT THE AIRPORT

- AVOID WEARING SHOES, CLOTHING, JEWELRY AND ACCESSORIES THAT CONTAIN METAL.
- YOUR NAME SHOULD BE ON ALL CARRY ON AND CHECKED LUGGAGE.
- DO NOT LOCK OR TAPE YOUR CARRY ONS OR CHECKED PIECES OF LUGGAGE IN CASE THE TSA AGENTS MUST CHECK YOUR BAGS.
- PLEASE BE CERTAIN YOU HAVE ALL THE DOCUMENTATION YOU NEED TO CHECK-IN AT THE AIRPORT (PHOTO ID AND/OR AIRLINE TICKET).

TRAVEL TIPS AT THE AIRPORT

- ANYONE 18 YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER WILL NEED A PHOTO ID FOR CHECK-IN.
- AFTER YOU HAVE CHECKED-IN YOU WILL RECEIVE YOUR BOARDING PASS AND PROCEED OVER TO BRING YOUR LUGGAGE THROUGH THE SECURITY SCREENING. IF YOU DON'T HAVE LUGGAGE YOU WILL PROCEED TO THE SECURITY CHECKPOINT.
- ONCE YOU ARE READY TO GO THROUGH THE SECURITY CHECKPOINT YOU WILL NEED TO HAVE YOUR PHOTO ID ALONG WITH YOUR BOARDING PASS IN HAND.
- ALL LOOSE CHANGE, KEYS, CELL PHONES, PLASTIC BAGS CONTAINING LIQUIDS OR GELS AND LAP TOPS THAT MAY BE IN YOUR CARRY ON NEED TO GO INTO THE GREY SECURITY BIN TO EXPEDITE THE SECURITY PROCESS. ALSO, YOU WILL NEED TO TAKE OFF YOUR OUTER COAT & SHOES AND PLACE THEM IN THE BIN.
- THINK BEFORE YOU SPEAK. BELLIGERENT BEHAVIOR, INAPPROPRIATE JOKES AND THREATS WILL NOT BE TOLERATED. THIS WILL RESULT IN DELAYS AND POSSIBLY MISSING YOUR FLIGHT.
- ONCE YOU HAVE GONE THROUGH THE SECURITY CHECKPOINT AND COLLECTED ALL OF YOUR ITEMS YOU WILL THEN PROCEED TO YOUR ASSIGNED GATE.

CARRY ON BAGGAGE

EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 26, 2006 TSA IS LIMITING LIQUIDS, GELS, PASTES AND/OR AEROSOLS IN CARRY ON BAGGAGE. TRAVELERS ARE CURRENTLY ALLOWED TO BRING ONE CLEAR 1 QUART SIZE, PLASTIC BAG CONTAINING LIQUIDS, GELS, PASTES AND/OR AEROSOLS IN CONTAINERS OF 3.4OZ. CAPACITY OR LESS PER CONTAINER (MOST TRAVEL SIZE ITEMS ARE 3OZ. OR LESS). THE CONTENTS OF THE PLASTIC BAG MUST FIT COMFORTABLY WITHIN AND BE COMPLETELY CLOSED/SEALED. THESE ITEMS WILL BE SUBJECTED TO X-RAY INSPECTION SEPARATE FROM THE TRAVELER'S CARRY ON BAG.

ADDITIONALLY, TRAVELER'S MAY HAVE BABY FORMULA/MILK, BABY FOOD IN CONTAINERS IF A BABY OR SMALL CHILD IS TRAVELING, MEDICATIONS (LIQUID, GEL AND AEROSOL), LIQUIDS (TO INCLUDE JUICE) OR GELS FOR DIABETIC OR OTHER MEDICAL NEEDS **BUT** THESE MUST BE DECLARED AT THE TSA SECURITY CHECKPOINT.

- ONE CARRY ON PLUS ONE SMALLER, PERSONAL-TYPE ITEM (PURSE, BRIEFCASE, ETC.).
- THE CARRY ON BAG CANNOT EXCEED 45 INCHES WHEN YOU TOTAL LENGTH PLUS WIDTH PLUS HEIGHT (22"L X 14"W X 9"H).
- ANY MEDICATION NEEDS TO BE CARRIED IN THE ORIGINAL CONTAINER WITH PHARMACY LABEL. IF THIS IS NOT
 POSSIBLE, YOU MUST CARRY A COPY OF THE PRESCRIPTION.


Liquids Rule

You are allowed to bring a quart-sized bag of liquids, aerosols, gels, creams and pastes in your carry-on bag and through the checkpoint. These are limited to travel-sized containers that are 3.4 ounces (100 milliliters) or less per item. Placing these items in the small bag and separating from your carry-on baggage facilitates the screening process. Pack items that are in containers larger than 3.4 ounces or 100 milliliters in checked baggage.

Any liquid, aerosol, gel, cream or paste that alarms during screening will require additional screening.


Carry-On Bag

3.4 ounces (100 ml) or smaller sized containers that fit in 1 quart-sized, resealable bag may go in carry-on and through checkpoint security.



Checked Bag

Containers that are larger than 3.4 ounces (100ml) regardless of amount inside must be in checked baggage.



Exemptions

- Medications
- Infant and child nourishments

Inbound International Flights

You may carry duty free liquids in secure, tamper-evident bags, more than 3.4 oz or 100 ml in your carry-on bag if:

- The duty free liquids were purchased internationally and you are traveling to the United States with a connecting flight.
- The liquids are packed in a transparent, secure, tamper-evident bag by the retailer and do not show signs of tampering when presented to TSA for screening.
- The original receipt for the liquids is present and the purchase was made within 48 hours.

The items inside the secure, tamper-evident bags must be screened and cleared. Any item that alarms or is unable to be screened will not be permitted in your carry-on bag. We recommend packing all liquids, gels, and aerosols that are over 3.4 oz or 100 ml in your checked baggage, even if they are in a secure, tamper-evident bag.

Liquids more than 3.4 oz or 100 ml not in a secure, tamper-evident bag must be packed in checked baggage.



Travel Checklist

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Before Packing
 Liquids, gels and aerosols packed in carry-on must follow the 3-1-1 liquids rule: 3.4 ounces or less per container 1 quart size, clear, plastic, zip top bag (all liquids must fit in bag) 1 bag per passenger Review the prohibited items list for both carry-on and checked baggage. If purchasing a baggage lock, be sure to look for those that are TSA recognized. Tape a card with your name and contact information on your electronics.
When Packing
Pack items in layers (shoes one layer, clothes one layer, electronics one layer, etc.) Firearms are only allowed in checked baggage and must be unloaded, placed in a locked, hard-sided container and declared to your airline. All fireworks contain explosive materials and are not permitted in checked or carry-on baggage. Pack large electronics on top layer of carry-on for screening accessibility. Place your 3-1-1 bag with liquids, gels and aerosols in the front pocket of your carry-on for accessibility. If traveling with a pet, be sure to bring a leash so carriers can be properly screened.
Before Leaving for the Airport
 □ Give yourself enough time to arrive at the airport early. □ Wear easily removable shoes. □ Passengers with a <u>disability or medical condition</u> may call ahead to the TSA Cares toll free helpline at (855) 787-2227.
Before Entering the Checkpoint
 □ Eligible passengers look for the <u>TSA Pre√® lane</u> for expedited screening at participating airports. □ Have your <u>ID</u> and boarding pass out for inspection.
In Standard Screening Lane
 Remove the 3-1-1 liquids bag and place it in the bin. Ensure pockets are empty (keys, tissues, currency, wallets, cell phones, etc.) and remove bulky jewelry (valuable items can be placed in carry-on).

Remove your shoes and place them directly on the X-ray belt.
Remove personal electronic devices larger than a cell phone from your carry-on bag and place them
into a bin with nothing placed on or under them for X-ray screening. (E.g. laptops, tablets, e-readers and
handheld game consoles.)
Remember to check the bins and collect all belongings after going through screening.

Identification

Adult passengers 18 and over must show valid identification at the airport checkpoint in order to travel.

- Driver's licenses or other state photo identity cards issued by Department of Motor Vehicles (or equivalent)
- U.S. passport
- · U.S. passport card
- DHS trusted traveler cards (Global Entry, NEXUS, SENTRI, FAST)
- U.S. Department of Defense ID, including IDs issued to dependents
- Permanent resident card
- · Border crossing card
- DHS-designated enhanced driver's license
- Federally recognized, tribal-issued photo ID
- HSPD-12 PIV card
- Foreign government-issued passport
- · Canadian provincial driver's license or Indian and Northern Affairs Canada card
- Transportation worker identification credential
- U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Employment Authorization Card (I-766)
- U.S. Merchant Mariner Credential

Beginning Oct. 1, 2020, if you plan to use your state-issued ID or license to fly within the U.S., make sure it is REAL ID compliant. If you are not sure if your ID complies with REAL ID, check with your state department of motor vehicles.

A weapon permit is not an acceptable form of identification. A temporary driver's license is not an acceptable form of identification.

Children

TSA does not require children under 18 to provide identification when traveling with a companion within the United States. Contact the airline for questions regarding specific ID requirements for travelers under 18.

Forgot Your ID?

In the event you arrive at the airport without valid identification, because it is lost or at home, you may still be allowed to fly. The TSA officer may ask you to complete an identity verification process which includes collecting information such as your name, current address, and other personal information to confirm your identity. If your identity is confirmed, you will be allowed to enter the screening checkpoint. You may be subject to additional screening, to include a patdown and screening of carry-on property.

You will not be allowed to enter the security checkpoint if your identity cannot be confirmed, you chose to not provide proper identification or you decline to cooperate with the identity verification process.

TSA recommends that you arrive at least two hours in advance of your flight time.

If your identity cannot be verified, you will not be allowed to enter the screening checkpoint.

*Screening procedures are governed by federal law and designed to detect threats to aviation security. TSA officers do not search for marijuana or other drugs; however, if an item is found that may violate federal law during security screening, TSA will refer the matter to law enforcement. Whether or not marijuana is considered medical marijuana federal law provides no basis to treat medical marijuana differently than non-medical marijuana.

**Snow globes that appear to contain less than 3.4 ounces (approximately tennis ball size) will be permitted if the entire snow globe, including the base, is able to fit in the same one clear, plastic, quart-sized, re-sealable bag, as the passenger's other liquids, such as shampoo, toothpaste and cosmetics.

*** Illegal controlled substances: TSA's screening procedures, which are governed by federal law, are focused on security and are designed to detect potential threats to aviation and passengers. As has always been the case, if during the security screening procedures an officer discovers an item that may violate federal law, TSA refers the matter to law enforcement. Law enforcement officials will determine if further action is appropriate.

TSA Prohibited Items List

The TSA Prohibited Items List is not intended to be all-inclusive and is updated as necessary. To ensure a traveler's security, Transportation Security Officers (TSOs) may determine that an item not on the Prohibited Items List is prohibited.

The final decision rests with TSA on whether to allow any items through security checkpoints.

Travelers are encouraged to check with their airline or travel agent for policies as individual airlines may place additional restrictions on any item.

Please note that some items are illegal in certain states and will be subject to state laws. It is the traveler's responsibility to be aware of state laws in both origination and destination cities.

Please pay careful attention to the "NOTE" included at the bottom of each section – they contain important information about restrictions and exceptions.
